

A Message from Pastor Jonathan:

Today we are more tied up in things made by humans than ever before. Between TV, movies, and social media, we spend more time on entertainment than any previous generation. Additionally, more of our time is spent indoors then even 20-30 years ago. Air conditioning has been a major factor in North Americans going out less in the evening over last 60 years. Since we are inside in our own homes, we experience more isolation and less connection with other individuals and with the community as a whole.

But the more time we spend surrounded by human-made things, the less time we spend surrounded by God-made things. We are that much less likely to encounter that which inspires awe in us. We are less likely to be drawn into that spontaneous wonder that has the chance to lead to spontaneous worship.

I think this is one factor in our culture pulling away from being tuned to the divine, to our Creator. When we encounter nature, it gives us the opportunity to ponder our relationship to a God who made it all.

In the space race in the 1960s, several US astronauts responded to their encounter with space by thinking about the divine. John Glenn said, "To look out at this kind of creation and not believe in God is, to me, impossible." Similarly, Neil Armstrong described his experience of seeing the Earth from a distance with these words: "It suddenly struck me that that tiny pea, pretty and blue, was the Earth. I put up my thumb and shut one eye, and my thumb blotted out the planet Earth. I didn't feel like a giant. I felt very, very small." The 8th person to walk on the moon was astronaut James Irwin, who grew up in Pittsburgh. He said, "I felt the power of God as I'd never felt it before."

The psalmist writes, "The heavens declare the glory of God" (Psalm 19:1). We serve the God who created those very stars that sing his glory. His is more powerful than we can understand. We are in a season as a church that will require God to do what only he can do. If we are to disaffiliate from the United Methodist denomination, it will require God to multiply the financial means we have. But God is in the business of doing things that only he can, when we call out to him and do what we can. Let's continue in our fervent prayers and work for his kingdom through Cabot Church, and let's see what God can do!



This Month's Safety & Security Article is About Safely Enjoying the Digital World.

There are some people who just enjoy drama and some who really enjoy creating it. Are all of your social media followers positive or is it time to get rid of some of the negative ones? Most social media apps will let you block other users if you need to disconnect them from your online life. Learning how to block people online is an essential skill. It's also worth reporting some troublemakers. Social media companies can stop them from posting or messaging for a bit, or in extreme cases, stop them from using their apps.

Here's the hard bit though; it's really important that we don't respond to users who are being negative or downright horrible. Before you do anything, unplug yourself for a few minutes and do something else. Always block and always report bad things.

How well should you allow a stranger to know you? That may sound a little odd but letting strangers become your follower online, means that they'll see everything you post, even the things you only really want your friends to see. Would you show your pictures to random people in the street? Probably not, so why do the same thing online? While it's good to celebrate the best bits of life, some things need to be kept offline. Post nothing that identifies who you are or where you go to school or live, no phone numbers, addresses or usernames. Always check with the app about what your followers can see and find out what you can't always hide - your bio on Instagram for example is always public. Check your privacy settings and make sure your account is always set to private.

Social media can be fun but it can also make you feel under pressure to post certain things, do things, or fish for likes and popularity. It can feel a bit like a competition when you try and get more likes than your friends, only there isn't a prize at the end of it. Some people feel so sad when no one likes their posts that they end up deleting it. You should do the things you enjoy rather than the things you think other people would enjoy. Be yourself online! Wouldn't the world be boring if we all did the same stuff?

Sometimes adults don't always understand the digital world but they do understand the people that use it. If something goes wrong online it's vital to talk to someone about it. We're probably not going to get kicked off of the internet because of someone else's behavior. Parents are a great place to start but also teachers, as well as any other professional you might come across in your life – Police, Social Workers, Health professionals and more.

There are so many connected devices on the market now, each with their own unique way of setting up parental controls and restrictions. Equally the functionality of these devices can be daunting with chat, game downloads, in-app purchases, third party apps on the devices (such as social media, Netflix) etc. To understand the Internet Of Things, look online for resources.

First, look up the device on YouTube using a simple 'how to' query, such as 'how to restrict in-app purchases on Playstation 4'. Secondly, Internet Matters has a one-stop shop for setting up devices which can be found here:https://www.internetmatters.org/parental-controls/
