## Cabot UMC Home Education Day

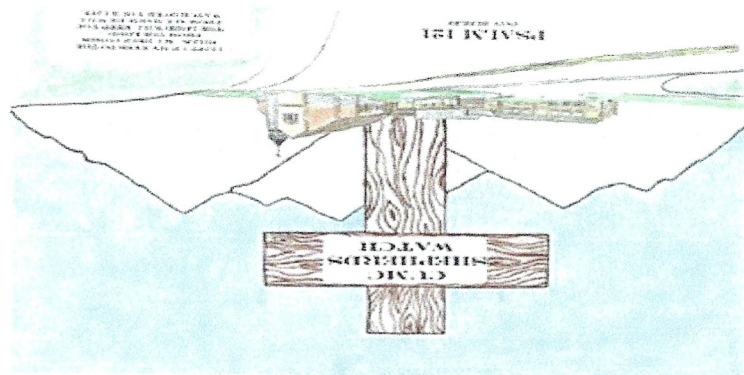

## December is Here – Let the Fun Begin!



December is a month where we have many things happening – our schedules and social calendars are full and there are gifts to buy or make and the family gatherings to be planned... and the question "Who's making the Christmas meal this year"?

Please take this time to enjoy your family and loved ones during this month where we celebrate the greatest expression of love – Jesus' birth. May your days be filled with happiness, joy and the comfort of the love that God has for us and the blessing of love that he has given us for each other.

There have been instances lately where a key was used to lock the east-side electronic controlled doors. This has resulted in a lock-out for those who do not have a key and an interruption of the function of the magnetic card access that controls the locking of those doors. I have put a "sticky dot" over the keyhole on the door, hoping to prevent the key locking, but it has been removed and a key used. Please do not do this. The doors will lock behind you after about 10-12 seconds, if the system is engaged. Please make sure that the doors both close and that one is not stopping the other from closing. A word to the wise is sufficient!

During this season it's important to be especially aware of your surroundings when shopping or just out & about. Thieves look for opportunities to steal what they can and regularly look for those vehicles that have signs of containing merchandise & gifts. The best thing to do is to have these items out of sight. If you can't do that, then do what you can by covering the items, and making them not plainly visible.

Winter greets us on December 21<sup>st</sup> and perhaps the snow will fly before then, most assuredly after the Winter Solstice we'll have that beautiful layer of white. Take extra caution when driving and make sure your tires have good tread and that you put a little more distance between your car and the one in front of you. Roads can be icy & slick, even when they don't look like they are that way.

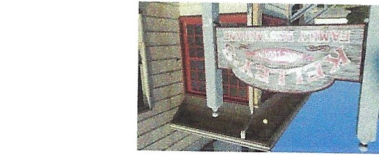

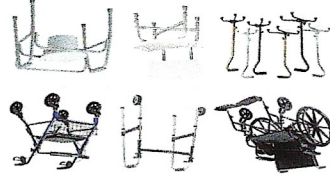

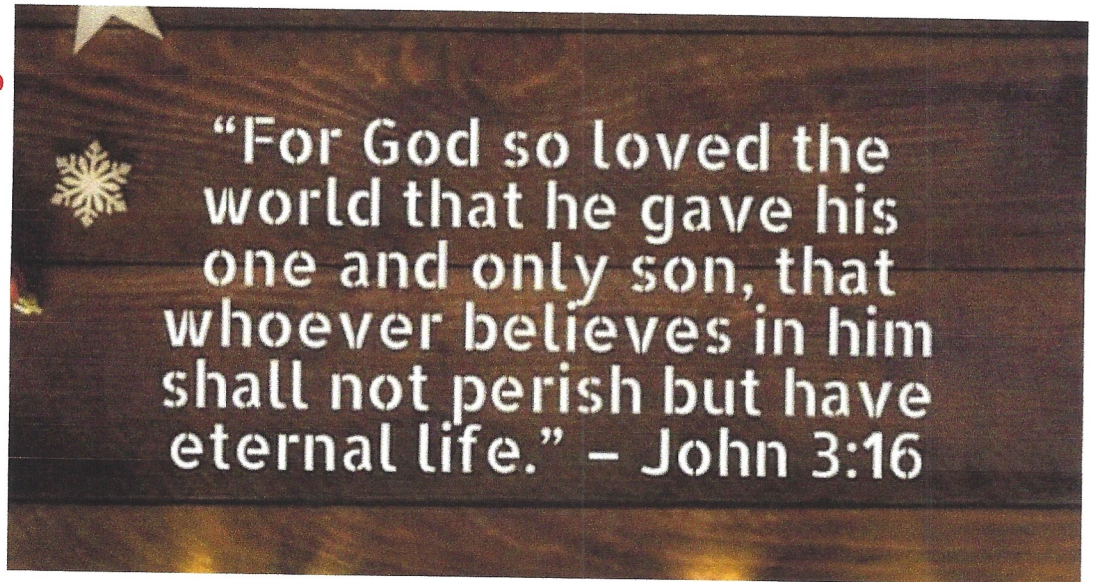
## PASTORAL CARE – MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

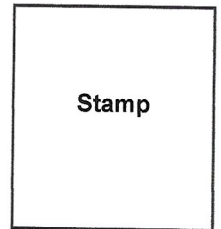
