



A Message from Pastor Jonathan:

"Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer." Romans 12:12

Joyful, patient, and faithful. These are three things the Apostle Paul challenges us to in this verse. First, we are in a time of hope as a local church. There are beautiful sings of life in our congregation. In the last month we have had baptisms (Bethany and Bennett Donehue), a wedding (Corrie and Jordan Kennedy), and a birth (Oaklynn Hogan). We have completed a new members class, and 8 people plan to join the church in October. We are starting a new ministry to the community, the Matrona Family Resource Center (launching Oct. 20). We are beginning a Life Group for men (starting Oct. 19). We are remembering our history as we celebrate the 20th anniversary of the church moving to this building with a potluck (Nov. 6). There are many other good things we can point to as we look forward to the future with hope. **Be joyful in hope!**

But everything is not perfect. We face affliction in different ways during this season. We still feel a sense of the loss of those brothers and sisters who used to be a part of this congregation but no longer worship with us. Over the last 10 years, some moved on during the pandemic, others left because of disagreements, and still others just drifted away and disconnected. Additionally, we face the possibility of disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. More than eighty percent of the church conference on Sept. 19 voted to begin the process of negotiations with the annual conference and to continue to discern if this is the right next step for the congregation. However, I don't think anyone, regardless of which way one voted, thinks that this is an ideal solution. The possibility is painful, even if it might be the best option for the church. We experience pain over this process. **Be patient in affliction.**

And then Paul mentions prayer. In the celebrations, the hope, the trials and challenges, we are to pray. There is no action that we can take that does not need prayer. Even when we think we have things under control, we need to pray. Especially when the world is swirling around us, too fast to keep up, we must pray. Through pray, God chooses to do things that he does not do when we don't pray. **Be faithful in prayer.**

In these times, be encouraged, and be joyful, patient, and faithful!





Church Conference:

Our annual church conference will be held Wednesday, Oct. 26 at 7:00 pm in our sanctuary. This is our normal meeting where we handle items of church business for the year, including approving lay servants and setting salaries. Everyone is able to attend, and all church members may vote. The agenda does not include any matters related specifically to disaffiliation, as that would be voted on at a special church conference sometime in the future.

Disaffiliation Discernment Update:

The special Cabot UMC church conference held on Sept. 19 voted 61-13-1 to begin negotiations with the annual conference to set the final terms of disaffiliation. Once those terms are set, Cabot UMC will hold another special church conference to vote on disaffiliation. Before that vote, there will be several public meetings for information, prayer, and discussion, so that everyone who is interested will have all the facts of the cost and the impact of disaffiliation. This will help the church discern the way forward in preparation for the actual vote. The church conference on Sept. 19 also elected members of the team authorized to negotiate with the conference. They are, in alphabetical order: Sara Donehue, Randy Fertelmes, Pat Jones, Roger Kennedy, Patty McGee, Audine Morris, and Evan Wimer. Please hold these sisters and brothers in prayer as you pray for our church during this season.

Building Anniversary Party:

It was 20 years ago in November that Cabot United Methodist Church held its first worship service in what used to be Winfield Elementary School! Let's come together to celebrate how God led us here, what he has done over the last twenty years, and the ways he is leading us into the future. We will have a potluck after the Sunday worship service on Nov. 6, around 11:45. This will be in the Multipurpose Room (where many of you remember setting up and tearing down chairs every week for worship). Please bring a dish to share, if you are able to. We will begin the meal with communion, and there will be a time of sharing memories, as well as fun games for the kids (and maybe adults too!). Please RSVP in the lobby or by contacting the church office, so we know how many to expect. It is also All Saints weekend, so we may have guests or those who haven't been here in a while joining us. If you have a Cabot shirt, whether a new one or one from years past, we encourage you to wear it to worship that day.

Community Pool:

Our church is a part of the Christian Leadership Network, a ministerial association of churches in the area. The CLN supports the full health of our community, including spiritual, physical, emotional, and relational health. One of the ways we are doing that is with a sizable donation toward the Sebco Swimming Pool. The pool association received a \$555,000 grant from the state, but since it is a matching grant, they are launching into a fundraising campaign. The CLN decided to take the lead in blessing the community by donating 1% of the needed funds: \$5,550. This is an opportunity for followers of Jesus to show that we care about the greater community, including its recreation. We are prayerfully hoping that this will also inspire other organizations and businesses in the region to offer their generous support of this community resource.
