# A Message from Pastor Jonathan:

We are at a pivotal time in the life of the United Methodist denomination. Cabot UMC and many other churches are discerning whether to continue in the denomination or to disaffiliate. There are many reasons that are bringing churches (mostly those with traditional, orthodox theology) to the point of asking this question. These include issues of doctrine and theology, the way we live out the Christian faith in relation to human sexuality, and problems with accountability and governance within the denomination. In the coming days you will be receiving a set of Messages of Vital Importance through the postal mail and email. This gives the background of the situation and the options the church has at this point. There is also a timeline of upcoming events in the process of discernment. I encourage you to read this information carefully and prayerfully as you seek to follow God's leading.

Last week in the message we talked about Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 13:13, "Now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." As we approach this season of discernment, let us be guided by these three characteristics.

Faith: We know that God is faithful. Whichever denomination we are serving him in, he is still true to his promises. He is able to grow us to be more like Jesus and able to use us for his Kingdom, no matter what name is above the door.

Hope: We know that God works all things together for the good for those who love him (Romans 8:28). Ultimately, everything will bring glory to God. Even when things are not the way we wish they were or the way we think is right, God is at work. Our hope is **not** in having power or control, neither in a denomination or nor in our government. Our hope is in **the Lord**. "We have put our hope in the living God, who is the Savior of all people, and especially of those who believe" (1 Timothy 4:10).

Love: "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:35). Jesus words remind us that our love is on display. In a situation where we have deep disagreements with others, we have to go to extremes to show love and respect for those who hold a different position. Nothing the world, the media, or Facebook tells you will lead you in this direction. But this is the command (13:34) given by the one we obey. It is not optional.

As we discern our direction, be prayerful and submitted to God as live in faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love.

"I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." John 16:33

We can begin by thanking him for promising us peace in the chaos, his Word which we keep in our hearts, and for another day to serve him.

# How Do We Keep Our Churches Safe in a World Where Evil Is Present?

The Time is Past for Naivety about the Need for Security. That First Baptist Church of Sutherland Springs was only around 100 members, in a town of 1,000 should, remind us that no church is immune from potential attack (26 killed & 20 injured). While we must resist the urge of irrational fear, churches must take seriously the question of security and be proactive in safeguarding their people.

#### Consider "Visible Deterrence."

A common theme among church security experts is the proactive effect of having security visible to both the congregation and potential attackers. One professional called this "visible deterrence." It is the idea that attackers look for 'soft', or easy targets, while they would be frightened off by the potential for pushback. Rather than having security hidden or blended into the people, an open presence amongst the people can both reassure and protect. While this may be good advice, many understand that some people will worry that this "visible deterrence" could actually deter honest people from the church. A balance needs to be thoughtfully navigated between the need for security and our overarching duty to welcome all kinds of people to church.

#### Training is Crucial.

An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. This is perhaps nowhere as true as in training your staff and congregation to respond to emergencies. More than simply knowing how to respond to violent situations, proper training helps prevent situations where security volunteers or attendees go overboard out of fear. Proper training is about teaching to discern the *right actions* under the *right situations*. Our church Security Moments talk during services and the Safety & Security Moments article here are efforts to train our attendees & staff.

#### A Reminder: Security is Under the Providence of God.

While security is necessary, no plan is foolproof. Where does that leave us? At the end of the day, we have to trust the Lord and live in faith, not fear. In addition to some outlined practical measures churches can use to help strengthen their security processes, we have to resist the urge to act out of fear. We live in a world groaning and broken under the weight of sin where evil knows where to find and harm the good. Yet despite this, scripture consistently calls us to not be afraid. We must remember that God is sovereign, all powerful, and loves us (Isa. 41:10).





If you have any questions, concerns, or ideas for this ministry please contact me. I am always excited to try something new and share my excitement with all of you and those beautiful children in our world!






